We hope to do this with a Spirit of Christian generosity that brings us closer to the blessing of unity, peace and reconciliation.



Jesus proclaimed the good news of the kingdom and cured every sickness among the people.

In today's reading, Jesus heals a man who was deaf and had a speech impediment. This is a story about Jesus' healing power, and in it, we find clues about our understanding of the sacrament. We are struck by the physical means used to heal the man, spittle and touch. The Church continues to celebrate the sacraments using physical means. In the Sacrament of Baptism, water and oil are used. In the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, we are anointed with holy oil on the forehead and the hands. In the Eucharist, bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ. We are sacramental people who believe that God's grace is given to us also through these physical signs.

Di lui *dicevano: "Ha fatto bene ogni cosa: fa udire i sordi e fa parlare i muti!".* Per mezzo dell'attività di Gesù, il messia atteso, viene rinnovata la creazione decaduta.

All Things Well



The incident in today's Gospel is recorded only by Mark. The key line is what the crowd says at the end: "He has done all things well." This echoes the creation story in Greek, recalling that God saw all the things He had done and declared them good. Mark also deliberately evokes Isaiah's promise, which

we hear in today's First Reading, that God will make the deaf hear and the mute speak. The crowd recognizes that Jesus is doing what the prophet had foretold. But Mark wants us to see something far greater—than to use the words from today's First Reading: "Here is your God." Notice how personal and physical the drama is in the Gospel. Our focus is drawn to a hand, a finger, ears, a tongue, spitting. In Jesus, Mark shows us; God has truly come in the flesh.

What He has done is to make all things new, a new creation. He has done for each of us what He did for that deafmute. He has opened our ears to hear the Word of God and loosed our tongues that we might sing praises to Him. Let us then give thanks to our glorious Lord Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. Let us say with Isaiah, "Here is our God, He comes to save us." Let us be rich in faith, that we might inherit the kingdom promised to those who love Him. - Scott Hahn

MESSAGE FROM BISHOP COLLI: Step 3 of Reopening

of Churches: On Friday, July 16th, we entered Step 3 of the province's reopening plan. This plan allows for full capacity of our churches, according to what proper social distancing will allow. Most probably still marking off every second pew at this time. The other safety protocols are still in place however. Masks must be worn; social distancing in and outside of church; sanitizing of hands at the doors; no congregational singing, but cantors and musicians are allowed; no shaking of hands, and Holy Communion only in the hand. No children's liturgies at this time and limited washroom access. No collections or processions. Funerals and weddings and baptisms may all be celebrated in the church with the above limits and protocols. We are awaiting some **updates** from the Ontario Bishops which will give us more details about this third step and reopening. We hope to see a lessening of these protocols as the summer continues. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact the Pastoral Centre for clarification. Thank you for your patience.
